

# UNISPORT AUSTRALIA (UNISPORT) GUIDELINE

## UAEC Awards and point score

The UniSport Australia Esports Championships (UAEC) is a trial competition for 2020 and is conducted in accordance with all major UniSport event guidelines, in particular the following:

- [Allocation of entrants to pools](#)
- [Breach of competition requirements](#)
- [Code of behavior extract](#)
- [Eligibility of competitors](#)

The UAEC will be delivered by the [Australian Esports League \(AEL\)](#), who will act as competition management for the duration of the championships.

This guideline provides the framework for the allocation of points within the UAEC to determine each competition winner and an overall UAEC Champion University.

## 1. Team/squad size

- Minimum registered players per team- 3
- Maximum registered players per team – 4 (one substitute)
- Maximum number of teams per university, per competition – 2

## 2. Eligibility

- 2.1. Entry is open to all eligible students as per the [UniSport Eligibility of Competitors guideline](#).
- 2.2. Competitors must only play with the Online Gamer ID (e.g. -PSN/Xbox/Nintendo Gamer ID) specified during the registration process.

## 3. Substitutions

- 3.1. Players can only be substituted between fixtures and not during a fixture
- 3.2. The AEL are to be notified of any player substitutions prior to the start of the fixture that the substitute has been made for.

## 4. Championship structure

The championships will be played online and will consist of four separate competitions in the following titles:

- Rocket League (PC, PlayStation 4, Xbox One, Nintendo Switch)
- FIFA 20 (PlayStation 4)

- Super Smash Bros. Ultimate (Nintendo Switch)
- Forza Motorsport 7 (PC and Xbox One)

## 5. Point score

5.1. Points will be allocated to the top eight placed teams in all four competitions as determined in each of the sport competition guidelines. The teams will receive points as per the below table:

Finishing position	Championship points awarded
1	8
2	7
3	6
4	5
5	4
6	3
7	2
8	1

5.2. The university with the greatest combined total point score at the completion of the championships will be deemed the overall UAEC Champion University

5.3. In the instance that two or more universities are tied for first place at the completion of the championships, they will be declared joint winners.

## 6. Forfeits

6.1. UAEC is run under the UniSport guideline – [Breach of competition requirements](#)

6.2. A forfeit will be declared as outlined in each of the four competition guidelines where either team is unable to complete an entire fixture.
