About 3x3Hustle



The National Basketball League and Basketball Australia have joined forces to bring the world's fastest growing urban team sport to all Australians with 3x3Hustle.

3x3 basketball is now a major global sport and upcoming Olympic event. The 3x3Hustle system provides a pathway for aspiring players to rise from the suburbs of Australia to the World stage.

The 3x3Hustle system has four entry levels from Street Hustle up to Pro Hustle. The 3x3Hustle events are endorsed by FIBA, with all events giving participants FIBA 3x3 World ranking points.

Street Hustles are smaller scale events that will be run by 3x3Hustle Franchises throughout the year around Australia. Each Franchise will select a male and female team in each age group to advance through to the Urban Hustle.

The Urban Hustle will be a series of larger events held in suburban and regional centres around Australia. Urban Hustles will be held act as qualifying events for the Big Hustle.

Big Hustle State will be run in each State and Territory between January and March each year. This will be the qualifier into Big Hustle National, which is the best of the best teams

in Australia battling it out for National Championship glory. For open ages, this is the chance to get on the National High Performance radar for next season's Pro Hustle Tour!

The Pro Hustle tour is the pinnacle of the 3x3Hustle, and there were three events in 2019 during March and April. With a \$150k prize pool on offer and guaranteed slots in FIBA's World Pro Tour, there was plenty to play for.

With 3x3 basketball making its debut at the Tokyo Olympics in 2020, this provides an opportunity for Australian players to be selected for the Olympic team through their performances in 3x3Hustle events.

About the event

For 2019, UniSport Australia and 3x3Hustle have joined forces to brand the UniSport Nationals Div 1 3x3 basketball event as the **3x3 Big Hustle - Uni**.



In addition to the winners of both the men's and women's competitions receiving a Nationals Div 1 pennant and gold medal, they also qualify for the 5th FISU World University Cup – to be held from 30 October to 3 November in Xiamen, China – and will also qualify to participate in the *Pro Hustle Final* in early-2020.

This opportunity allows them to participate for significant prize money, as well as to earn a place on the FIBA World Pro Tour, and even place them in the eye of selectors for the 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

Eligibility

With this event being a FISU continental qualifier, it should be noted that any teams that qualify to the FISU World University Cup will only be able to substitute a maximum of two of their four players from the 3x3 Big Hustle - Uni.

Teams should be aware that FISU regulations state that athletes must be less than 24 years of age on January 1st in the year of the event.

The above substitution clause will also apply afterwards to any teams that qualify further to the FIBA World Tour Masters, in that a maximum of two players from the WUC will be able to be substituted.





Venue information

Pop-up courts placed along northern end of Eastern Ave (opposite law school building).



Facilities and amenities

Two pop-up FIBA 3x3 courts will be set up along the northern end of Eastern Ave (opposite the law school building). In the case of adverse weather conditions, the competition will re-locate to Sydney Uni Sports & Aquatic Centre indoor basketball courts.

Cafes, water refill stations, toilets and ATMs are located close by and grandstand seating will be placed around the courts for spectators.

Uniform & accreditation collection

Teams can collect their uniforms and accreditation from the event site (Eastern Ave) Any of the registered team members may collect all items for their entire team.

Collections will be available on Wednesday 7 August from 12-4pm, or on Thursday 8 August from 8.00am.

Accreditation process

All registered participants will be provided with a photo accreditation.

The accreditation process ensures that only eligible athletes participate in the event and protects the competitors from ineligible athletes causing potential insurance risks. For the 3x3 basketball event, the accreditation process has changed somewhat from traditional accreditation checks, however the overarching principle remains the same:

NO ACCREDITATION = NO PLAY

1. Upon arrival to the court prior to each match, participants present their accreditation pass to the score bench.
2. The participant will be checked in for that match by the referees.
3. The accreditation pass will remain at the score bench for the duration of the match.
4. At the conclusion of the match, the participant shall collect their accreditation pass from the score bench.



If a student loses their accreditation they will be required to purchase a new one for \$20.00, which can be arranged on site by contacting Eloise Ayre (Sport and Operations Manager – Nationals) on 0412 446 599.

Competition structure



The 2019 Big Hustle - Uni competition comprises of 18 men's teams and 10 women's teams. Teams will be placed in pools based on seedings from last year's results combined with the random seeding process completed at this year's UniSport Conference.

2-Point Shoot Out

Each team is to nominate one player to participate in the 2-point shoot out. Three stations with five balls each to be shot within one minute. Each ball is one point with the last ball the 'money ball' being two points.

Basic 3x3 rules

3x3 has the same technical rules as traditional basketball, however the game format is different:

- 1 basket on 1 half-court (15m x 11m)
- 2 teams of 3 players and 1 substitute
- Initial possession determined by coin flip
- 12-seconds shot-clock
- 1st team to reach 21 points or best after 10 minutes win
- A traditional 2 pointer is worth 1 and a 3 pointer is worth 2
- 1 free throw following a shooting foul, 2 free throws if foul committed beyond the arc
- Foul limit of 6 team fouls
- Team fouls 7, 8, 9: 2 free throws
- Team fouls 10+: 2 free throws + possession
- Teams have no coach during play





Competition guidelines

3x3 Basketball

UniSport Australia (UniSport) 3x3 basketball competitions are conducted in accordance with the rules of the [Federation International Basketball Association \(FIBA\)](#) except where these differ from UniSport competition guidelines; in which case the latter shall take precedence.

1. Team/squad size

- Minimum registered players – 4
- Maximum registered players – 4
- Maximum cross registrations – 0
- Minimum number of players that can take the court without incurring a forfeit – 3

2. Competition format

- 2.1. Participants in all UniSport 3x3 basketball competitions will be required to register with FIBA [3x3planet.com](#) in addition to the UniSport registration process. This is a FISU regulation which enables the UniSport 3x3 competition to be registered with FIBA and for participants to have their results count towards FIBA planet rankings and world university league rankings (should a team qualify).

3. Game time/duration

- 3.1. All games will be 10 minutes in duration or first to 21 points (whichever comes first).
- 3.2. Clock stoppages will be in place for semi-finals and medal matches (free throws and dead ball situations).
- 3.3. When available, a 12 second shot clock will be used.

- 3.4. A summary of game time/duration is also available via the UniSport supplement – games time summary.

- 3.5. As per 3x3 rules each team will be granted one (1) 30-second time-out

4. Drawn matches

- 4.1. If any match is drawn at full time, an extra period of time shall be played with the first team to score two (2) points declared the winner. There will be a rest period of one minute before this period of extra time takes place.

5. Standings

- 5.1. Teams will be automatically allocated to the Standings (ladder) by FIBA Event Maker when the game results are entered.

- 5.2. For both in pools and in overall competition standings (other than standings in tours), the following classification rules shall apply.

If teams that have reached the same stage of the competition are tied the steps to break the tie shall be applied in the following order:

- a) Most wins (or win ratio in case of unequal number of games in inter-pool comparison);
- b) Head-to-head comparison (only taking win/loss into account and applies within a pool only);
- c) Most points scored in average (without considering winning scores of forfeits).

If teams are still tied after those 3 steps, the team(s) with the highest seeding win(s) the tie-breaker.

6. Forfeits

- 6.1. 3x3 basketball is run under the UniSport guideline - forfeit of competition requirements.
- 6.2. A forfeit will be declared five minutes after the scheduled start of play where either team is unable to commence play.

7. Uniform requirements

- 7.1. The specific uniform requirements for 3x3 basketball are as per the national sporting organisation standard with the following UniSport uniform requirements:
 - Official NBL 3x3 Big Hustle Playing Kit – Jersey (reversible black & green) and Shorts (black)
 - First named team on the schedule is to wear the black jersey and second named team to wear green.
 - Singlets must be tucked in when playing.
 - If undergarments are to be worn under the shorts they must be the same dominant colour as the shorts (i.e. black).
 - If undergarments are to be worn under the jersey (t-shirts or compression garments) they must be black.

8. Team duties

- 8.1. Team duty requirements for 3x3 basketball are:
 - One person from each team will be required for the duties of scoring and timekeeping for the match immediately following theirs.
 - One person from each team from the second scheduled match of the day will also be required to duty the first match of the day as well as the match following their own
- 8.2. The person fulfilling the team duty requirements can be any competent person associated with that team or university and does not necessarily have to be a player e.g. team manager.
- 8.3. Teams that do not fulfil team duties will be fined as per the UniSport guideline - forfeit of competition requirements.

Awards

Medals and trophies

Medals are awarded to first, second and third placed teams with a trophy being presented to the winners in each competition.

Presentations will be held at the end of the gold medal matches on the court.

Pennants

For each championship won, a pennant is awarded to the university that the winning team is representing. Pennants will be presented at the medal ceremony.

For a sport to be classified as a pennant, at least four teams from four different universities must be entered in the competition.

For 3x3 basketball, the following pennants will be awarded:

- Men's
- Women's

Overall awards

There are four overall awards presented to the winning universities. The awards are as follows:

1. **Overall Champion University**
Based on the number of pennants (championships) won across all sports. This award will be presented at the end of the year upon the completion of all Div 1 sports.
2. **Doug Ellis Per Capita Champion University**
Based on points accrued and enrolment numbers of the universities. This award will be presented at the end of the year upon the completion of all Div 1 and 2 sports.



Anti-doping control

UniSport condemns doping as fundamentally contrary to the spirit of sport, with anti-doping programs seeking to preserve what is intrinsically valuable about sport.

All participants are bound by the [UniSport Illicit Drugs in Sport Policy](#) & the [UniSport Anti-Doping Policy](#), which is approved by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) who have legislative authority to investigate possible violations of the anti-doping rules under the *ASADA Act 2006*.



ASADA offer a free and easy to use online education tool featuring online courses, videos and learning updates. It provides everyone with the opportunity to learn about the key areas of anti-doping such as prohibited substances and methods. All participants – both competitors and non-competitors are encouraged to complete the Level 1 Anti-Doping Course from the [ASADA eLearning](#) website.
