- Athletes want to represent their university and be part of a national basketball tournament dedicated to university students
- Student experience is important to Universities and students
- University involvement and capability of delivering a high performance activity
- Include more games but retain focus on interstate competition
- Dedicated platform for livestream ensuring rights/ ownership maintained by UniSport but accessible to all participating unis
- Enhance quality and experience of the livestream



How do unis become involved?

Submit an application and if accepted will be required to pay a License Fee

Must enter both men's and women's competition

- What's included in license fee?
- Competition management
- Flights
- Accommodation (where teams play double headers)
- Technical officials (referees, statisticians, score bench officials)
- Livestream/ OTT platform
- Access to intellectual property



What is required?

UBL Team requirements:

- Squad of 16
- Provide playing uniforms and clash kit
- Players registered with state association
- 17-25 years of age
- Restrictions on player remuneration
- Nominate representative for UBL Commission
- Marketing plan
- Player profiles
- Team support staff coach, manager, physio

Hosting obligations:

- Venue
- Game Day commissioner
- Livestream and commentary costs
- Court announcer
- Game day set up and equipment
- Match day volunteers eg floor wipers, photography
- Liaison with visiting team

- Men's and Women's competition
- Matches mid-week on campus to maximise student support
- 6-week competition in September/October
- Travelling team 11 players plus 2 officials
- Streaming of matches on UniSport and University platforms
